I. PROFILE OF THE ORGANISATION

RAMAKRISHNA MATH AND RAMAKRISHNA MISSION: Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission are twin organizations forming the core of a worldwide spiritual movement (known as Ramakrishna Movement or Vedanta Movement), which aims at harmony of religions, harmony of the East and the West, harmony of the ancient and the modern, spiritual fulfilment, all-round development of human faculties, social equality, and peace for all humanity, without any distinctions of creed, caste, race or nationality.

RAMAKRISHNA MATH is a monastic organization for men brought into existence by Sri Ramakrishna (1836-1886), the great 19th century saint of Bengal who is regarded as the Prophet of the Modern Age.

RAMAKRISHNA MISSION is a registered society in which monks of Ramakrishna Math and lay devotees cooperate in conducting various types of social service mainly in India. It was founded by Sri Ramakrishna's chief apostle, Swami Vivekananda (1863-1902), one of the foremost thinkers and religious leaders of the present age, who is regarded as 'one of the main moulders of the modern world', in the words of an eminent western scholar A. L. Basham.

The Headquarters of these centres are situated in Belur Math, Howrah, W.B. All branch centres of the Ramakrishna Math come under the administrative control of the Board of Trustees, whereas all branch centres of the Ramakrishna Mission come under the administrative control of the Governing Body of the Ramakrishna Mission.

The main goals and objectives of these twin organizations, based on the principles of Practical Vedanta, are:

- ❖ To spread the idea of the potential divinity of every being and how to manifest it through every action and thought.
- ❖ To spread the idea of harmony of religions based on Sri Ramakrishna's experience that all religions lead to the realization of the same Reality known by different names in different religions. The Mission honours and reveres the founders of all the world religions such as Buddha, Christ and Mohammed.
- ❖ To treat all work as worship, and service to man as service to God.
- ❖ To make all possible attempts to alleviate human suffering by spreading education, rendering medical service, extending help to villagers through rural development centres, etc.
- ❖ To work for the all-round welfare of humanity, especially for the uplift of the poor and the downtrodden.
- ❖ To develop harmonious individuals through their combined practice of Jnana, Bhakti, Yoga and Karma.

The motto of Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission is: 'Atmano mokshartham jagad hitaya cha: For one's own liberation, and for the welfare of the world.'

Although Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission are legally and financially separate, they are closely inter-related in several other ways, and are to be regarded as twin organizations. The Math and the Mission together have 172 branch centres all over India and in different parts of the world.

Legal Standing: RAMAKRISHNA MISSION is a registered society in which monks of Ramakrishna Math and lay devotees cooperate in conducting various types of social service mainly in India.

Registration Status: Registered in 1909 as the Ramakrishna Mission under act XXI of 1860.



II. A PROFILE OF THE UNIVERSITY

The Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University came into existence by virtue of a Gazette Notification dated 5 January 2005 of the Government of India. The notification was mooted by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, under section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act of 1956. The formal inauguration of the university took place on 4 July 2005, Swami Vivekananda's Mahasamadhi day. The first convocation of the university was held on 2 September 2006 at its first off-campus centre of Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education, Coimbatore.



Swami Vivekananda envisioned that Belur Math would be a centre of great harmony and synthesis, not only of all religious beliefs and traditions, but also of arts and sciences and the various branches of knowledge, both secular and spiritual. It would be the centre of great spiritual and cultural awakening.

Aims and Objectives – The Vision: The present university is intended to actualize Swami Vivekananda's fundamental educational ideas of imparting life-building, man-making and character-building education by combining the best elements of the East and the West. The aim of the institute is to provide opportunities for education and research in the disciplines of arts sciences and spiritual studies. Value education will therefore be an essential component in all the courses.

Administrative Aspects: The University will be an international university that could operate through and from any of the branch-centres of Ramakrishna Mission in India and abroad. It is a cluster of institutions, all of them belonging to branches of Ramakrishna Mission, with headquarters at Belur Math.



The Major Thrust Areas: To start with, four major thrust areas were chosen because these have received little emphasis in any of the other conventional universities in India. They are thus the gap-areas in which the present university would operate.

- * Disability Management and Special Education
- * Integrated Rural Development including Tribal Development
- * Indian Cultural & Spiritual Heritage and Value Education
- * Disaster Management including Relief and Rehabilitation

Specialized Faculty Centres: For each of these thrust areas, selected centres of the Ramakrishna Mission, called Specialized Faculty Centres, were short listed to harness their past experience and expertise. Till date, the following Faculties have been started and are offering courses in related areas:

A. DISABILITY MANAGEMENT AND SPECIAL EDUCATION: International Human Resource Development Centre (IHRDC) for the Disabled at the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu, became the first faculty of the University, namely, Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education (FDMSE). The centre was already involved in training Special Education professionals at the national and international levels.

A formal inauguration of six courses in the FDMSE was made at the IHRDC on August 2005. The courses inaugurated were as follows:

1. BEd in Special Education (Visual Impairment)
2. BEd in Special Education (Hearing Impairment)
3. BEd in Special Education (Mental Retardation)
4. MEd in Special Education (Visual Impairment)
5. MEd in Special Education (Hearing Impairment)
6. MEd in Special Education (Mental Retardation)

Besides these courses, research programmes leading to PhD were also initiated.

B. INTEGRATED RURAL DEVELOPMENT INCLUDING TRIBAL DEVELOPMENT:

The University Grants Commission approved the following Faculty Centers as 'Off Campus' centers of the RKMVU for offering courses in rural and tribal development:

1. **Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama, Morabadi, Ranchi, Jharkhand:** A Faculty of 'Integrated Rural and Tribal Development' (IRTD) was started and it is offering a five-year integrated MSc Course IRTD and one year Post Graduate Diploma in 'Agro-based Bio-technology'.
2. **Ramakrishna Mission Loka Siksha Parishad, Narendrapur, West Bengal:** On 25 September 2006, a Faculty for Integrated Rural Development and Management (IRDM) at Narendrapur Centre, Kolkata, was inaugurated by the General Secretary of the Ramakrishna Math & Mission. The Faculty is offering a two year MSc Course in IRDM and one year Post Graduate Diploma in Agro-based Bio-technology.

C. INDIAN SPIRITUAL AND CULTURAL HERITAGE AND VALUE

EDUCATION: To sensitize and expose the youth of India to the great ideas embedded in our hoary heritage, a series of course called 'Integral Self Development' (Susamanvita Atma-vikas) were planned. The first of these courses, a diploma on 'Holistic Living with an Elevated Mind', was inaugurated on 9 December 2005 by Rev. President Maharaj of the Ramakrishna Math and Mission.

The Ramakrishna Institute of Moral and Spiritual Education, Mysore, Karnataka, has been entrusted to start a separate faculty to cater to such subjects.



D. VIVEKANANDA RESEARCH CENTRE AND VIVEKANANDA SCHOOL OF FUNDAMENTAL SCIENCE AND PHILOSOPHY: Vivekananda Research Centre for fundamental science and philosophy is located in Swami Vivekananda's ancestral house in Kolkata to conduct research on various aspects of Indian culture and philosophy, Ramakrishna-Vivekananda thought, Vedanta vis-à-vis modern science, consciousness studies, and some areas of fundamental science. Among the fundamental sciences, contemplated topics are theoretical physics, pure mathematics and theoretical computer science, to start with.

The formal inauguration of the 'Vivekananda School of Fundamental Science and Philosophy' and 'Vivekananda



Research Centre' was held at the Vivekananda's ancestral house on 4 July 2005. Later, the University Grants Commission approved the Vivekananda Research Centre for doctoral and post-doctoral research in Mathematical Sciences, Philosophy, Ramakrishna-Vivekananda thought, Consciousness Studies, etc.

System of Credit Accumulation: The university offers courses through credit accumulation system, thereby enabling students to complete the courses at their own pace. The award of credits for theory and practical hours are decided by the Academic Councils and the Boards of Studies of the respective Faculties constituted by the university.

III. A PROFILE OF THE FACULTY OF GENERAL & ADAPTED PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND YOGA

The Faculty of General & Adapted Physical Education and Yoga (GAPEY) had its inception in the resolution adopted by the Board of Management of the University in its meeting held on 02.07.2006.

CAMPUS: The Faculty of GAPEY is located in the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, a major educational centre of the Ramakrishna Mission. The Vidyalaya is situated 19 kms from Coimbatore City on the highway to Ootacamund, and is set in a serene environment spread over nearly 300 acres. The Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, was started in 1930 with an investment of Rs. 5.75 and one harijan boy on its roll. Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation, laid the foundation stone of the Vidyalaya in one of its temporary campuses in early 1934. Later in the year, the Vidyalaya moved finally to its

present sprawling campus. The Vidyalaya was affiliated to the Ramakrishna Mission in January 1935. Over a period of more than 75 years, the Vidyalaya has grown into a comprehensive and reputed complex with 19 educational institutions training over 6500 students every year, offering them facilities for education ranging from the pre-school to doctoral levels.

The Faculty, besides its building, has a spacious hostel with adequate facilities to accommodate around 300 students, a multi purpose spacious auditorium, fitness centre, and adequate play grounds, both indoor and outdoor.

Laboratories: In addition to the classrooms and the lecture halls, the Faculty has additional rooms for the following laboratories:

1. Educational Psychology and Sports Psychology
2. Educational Technology and Media
3. Anatomy and Exercise Physiology
4. Health, Physiotherapy and Sports Medicine
5. Kinesiology and Biomechanics



Library and Information Centre: The Faculty has a good library with adequate books, journals and magazines. This library has adequate collection of extensive reference books including encyclopaedias, dictionaries, and multimedia facilities.

Auditorium: Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya has a common spacious auditorium, named the GKD auditorium, which can accommodate nearly 800 persons. Cultural functions, get-togethers, seminars, memorial lectures, etc. are held in this auditorium. A well-maintained garden surrounds this auditorium, and a canteen is located adjacent to it.

Academic Discipline: The students are closely counselled and guided so that they attend to their assigned works at the allotted times. The day is scheduled to cater to the different needs of our students under the efficient supervision of experienced teachers. Most of the time of a student is spent in the campus either in the reading room, class rooms, playgrounds or attending to their hostel routine. Permission from the hostel warden / supervisor is compulsory to leave the campus. Normally, visitors are not allowed during study hours.

Hostel: The Faculty has a neat and simple hostel that can accommodate about 300 students. A full-time warden looks after the activities of the hostel with the assistance of some supervisors. He stays in the hostel

round the clock and attends to the needs of the students, acting as a friend, philosopher and guide. There are two dining halls and a kitchen for the students.

There is a separate hostel for overseas students studying in the GAPEY and the FDMSE.

Canteen: The Faculty has a canteen facility for the students and teachers while they are on the campus. This canteen is open also to the parents, visitors and guests of the institution. It functions from about 8 am to 6 pm on all working days.

Playfields: The campus has a multi-purpose spacious auditorium, a fitness centre, and several playgrounds, both indoor and outdoor. It also has extensive play facilities that include a 400 mtrs track, standard fields for hockey, football, volleyball, tennis, ball badminton, kabbaddi, etc., for the students, and also local persons who are interested in physical culture.

A well-equipped indoor stadium of international standard is a special feature of this institution. A good physical fitness centre also is available for the students and staff of this college. This is kept open in the mornings and evenings so that the students can use this facility after the academic hours.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (PhD) IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION - FULLTIME

ELIGIBILITY:

- Full-time:** Candidates who possess MPhil in Physical Education are eligible to register for PhD in this University. Their basic degrees must be as per the regulation of this University or any other University accredited by UGC in the discipline of study co-relatable to those of the Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION: The medium of instruction will be English.

ENTRANCE EXAM: Candidates will be admitted for PhD programme only after successfully passing the entrance examination. A competent research committee will scrutinise the application in this regard and decide admission of candidates. All the students admitted to Ph.D. programme will have to undergo a full time course work for a minimum of 1 semester.

Note: There is a provision for fellowship for deserving candidates.

MASTER OF PHILOSOPHY (MPhil) IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION - FULLTIME

ELIGIBILITY: Candidates who have passed the post-graduate degree in Physical Education (MPEd) of any university or its equivalent with not less than 55% marks are eligible to apply for admission to the MPhil Course.

DURATION: The duration of the course will be for two semesters + dissertation, leading to PhD.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION: The medium of instruction will be English.

ENTRANCE EXAM: Candidates will be admitted for MPhil programme only after successfully passing the entrance examination. A competent research committee will scrutinise the application in this regard and decide admission of candidates. All the students admitted to M.Phil. programme will have to undergo a full time course work as will be prescribed.

Note: On completion of 2 semester of course work deserving and aspiring candidates may apply for admission to Ph.D. programme. There is a provision for fellowship for deserving candidates.

DPEd, BPEd and MPed COMMON GUIDELINES

GRADING SYSTEM: To pass an examination, a student has to score a minimum of 50% marks in each paper - Theory, Practice Teaching and Practical (Internal and External separately).

50%	-	Minimum Pass Marks
50 to 59%	-	Second Class
60% and above	-	First Class
75% and above	-	Distinction (in the first attempt)

ATTENDANCE: Minimum of 80 per cent attendance in theory and practical classes each year.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION: The medium of instruction will be English. Only DPEd students shall be given an option to write the exams in Tamil or Hindi.

COURSE OF STUDY: The total working days shall not be less than 180 working days in an academic year (each semester consists of not less than 90 working days, excluding examination days). Each working day shall consist of 4 hours of practical work (morning and evening, 2 hours each session) and 3 hours of theory in between.

VALUE EDUCATION: One paper on value education is a special feature of our Faculty. The paper carries 100 marks, and a minimum score of 50% is compulsory for a pass.

SUPPORTIVE PAPERS: English Communication Skills and Basics of Computer are compulsory for all the courses.

ADAPTED PHYSICAL EDUCATION: One paper in adapted physical education, preferably related to sports specialization, is mandatory for all the students. However, a student has the freedom to choose any other adapted game. The paper carries 100 marks, and a minimum score of 50% is compulsory for a pass.

MASTER OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION (MPed) - FULL TIME

ELIGIBILITY: A candidate for admission to the Master of Physical Education (MPed) degree programme should have passed the BPEd examination of this University or from any other University recognized as equivalent thereto. They must have represented a district / college / University / State in any one of the games or sports. He must be medically fit and free from physical deformities/diseases. Students will undergo medical examination at the time of admission.

DURATION: The duration of the course shall be four semesters.

RESEARCH PROJECT: The students should compulsorily submit a minor research project (dissertation) at the end of the fourth semester (100 marks).

COACHING PRACTICE: The MPEd students are responsible for planning, execution and conduct of coaching, sports, and games in various schools of the Coimbatore Educational District.

BACHELOR OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION (BPEd) - FULL TIME

ELIGIBILITY: A candidate shall be eligible for admission to the Bachelor of Physical Education (BPEd) if he has a bachelor degree of a recognized University.

DURATION: The duration of the course shall be two semesters.

Candidates must fulfil the following conditions:

EFFICIENCY IN SPORTS: Preference: He must have represented a college / University / District / State in any one of the games or athletics (as listed in the inter-university competitions).

He should be medically fit and free from any deformities/diseases. Students will undergo medical examination at the time of admission.

PRACTICE TEACHING: Undergoing 10 days Intensive Practice Teaching in neighbouring schools is compulsory for all the students (100 marks).

ANNUAL LEADERSHIP CAMP: Each student shall undergo a 10-day residential Annual Leadership Training Camp, organised by the Faculty (100 marks compulsory activity).

PROJECT SPORTS: Every year students are provided academic credits for successful execution of project sports. A group of students shall be given the responsibility of organising and officiating in a sports meet and tournament in nearby institutions (100 marks compulsory activity).

UNIFIED PLAY DAY: Each student must go to train middle-school students for Unified Play activities for a period of 15 days and assist his trainees for a combined mass drill at the Faculty campus (100 marks compulsory activity).

DIPLOMA IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION (DPEd) - FULL TIME

ELIGIBILITY: Any candidate possessing the qualification of +2 (Higher Secondary pass) with atleast 45% marks is eligible for admission.

DURATION: The duration of the course shall be four semesters.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE: Admission will be made on the basis of the following criteria:

1. Physical Fitness Test - (a) 100 mts, (b) 800 mts, (c) shot-put	-	50 Marks
2. Games Skill Test	-	50 Marks
3. Sports Certificate	-	20 Marks
Total	-	120 Marks

PROJECT SPORTS: Every year students are provided credits for successful execution of project sports. A group of students shall be given the responsibility of organising and officiating in a sports meet and tournament in nearby educational institutions (100 marks).

The first year students must compulsorily undergo coaching practice.

COACHING PRACTICE: The DPEd students are responsible for planning, execution, and conduct of coaching practice in sports in the numerous schools of the Coimbatore Educational District.

The second year students must compulsorily undergo the following specialized training:

1. **PRACTICETEACHING:** Undergoing Intensive Practice Teaching in neighbouring schools for 10 days is compulsory for students in the second year (100 marks).
2. **ANNUAL LEADERSHIP CAMP:** Each student shall undergo a 10-day residential Annual Leadership Training Camp organised by the Faculty (100 marks).
3. **UNIFIED PLAY DAY:** Each student must go to train children of nearby Middle Schools in the Unified Play activities for a period of 15 days and assist his trainees for a combined mass drill at the Faculty campus (100 marks compulsory activity).

BACHELOR OF SCIENCE IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION (BSc) - FULL TIME

ELIGIBILITY: Any candidate possessing the qualification of +2 (Higher Secondary pass) is eligible for admission.

DURATION: The duration of the course shall be six semesters.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE: Admission will be made on the basis of the following criteria:

1. Physical Fitness Test - (a) 100 mts, (b) 800 mts, (c) shot-put	-	50 Marks
2. Games Skill Test	-	50 Marks
3. Sports Certificate	-	20 Marks
	Total	- 120 Marks

PROJECT SPORTS: Every year students are provided credits for successful execution of project sports. A group of students shall be given the responsibility of organising and officiating in a sports meet and tournament in nearby educational institutions (100 marks).

The second year students must compulsorily undergo the following specialized training:

1. **PRACTICETEACHING:** Undergoing Intensive Practice Teaching in neighbouring schools for 10 days is compulsory for students in the second year (100 marks).
2. **ANNUAL LEADERSHIP CAMP:** Each student shall undergo a 10-day residential Annual Leadership Training Camp organised by the Faculty (100 marks).
3. **UNIFIED PLAY DAY:** Each student must go to train children of nearby Middle Schools in the Unified Play activities for a period of 15 days and assist his trainees for a combined mass drill at the Faculty campus (100 marks compulsory activity).

The third year students must compulsorily undergo the following specialized training:

1. **COACHING PRACTICE:** The BSc students are responsible for planning, execution, and conduct of coaching practice in sports in the numerous schools of the Coimbatore Educational District.

V. UNIFORM & SPORTS EQUIPMENT: The uniform for the students, as decided by the University, is fixed and is detailed in Annexure for the different courses. All the students have to procure personal equipment as specified for different games/sports at their own cost, depending upon the activity schedule.

VI. LOCATION AND ACCESS: The University campus is situated 19 kms from the Coimbatore City on the highway to Ootacamund.

VII. RULES AND REGULATIONS:

1. Dress code prescribed by the University must be followed in the campus.
