## I. PROFILE OF THE ORGANISATION

**RAMAKRISHNA MATH AND RAMAKRISHNA MISSION:** Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission are twin organizations forming the core of a worldwide spiritual movement (known as Ramakrishna Movement or Vedanta Movement), which aims at harmony of religions, harmony of the East and the West, harmony of the ancient and the modern, spiritual fulfilment, all-round development of human faculties, social equality, and peace for all humanity, without any distinctions of creed, caste, race or nationality.



**HEADQUARTERS: PANORAMIC VIEW FROM GANGES**

**RAMAKRISHNA MATH** is a monastic organization for men brought into existence by Sri Ramakrishna (1836-1886), the great 19th century saint of Bengal who is regarded as the Prophet of the Modern Age.

**RAMAKRISHNA MISSION** is a registered society in which monks of Ramakrishna Math and lay devotees cooperate in conducting various types of social service mainly in India. It was founded by Sri Ramakrishna's chief apostle, Swami Vivekananda (1863-1902), one of the foremost thinkers and religious leaders of the present age, who is regarded as 'one of the main moulders of the modern world', in the words of an eminent western scholar A. L. Basham.

The Headquarters of these centres are situated in Belur Math, Howrah, W.B. All branch centres of the Ramakrishna Math come under the administrative control of the Board of Trustees, whereas all branch centres of the Ramakrishna Mission come under the administrative control of the Governing Body of the Ramakrishna Mission.

**The main goals and objectives of these twin organizations, based on the principles of Practical Vedanta, are:**

- D** To spread the idea of the potential divinity of every being and how to manifest it through every action and thought.
- D** To spread the idea of harmony of religions based on Sri Ramakrishna's experience that all religions lead to the realization of the same Reality known by different names in different religions. The Mission honours and reveres the founders of all the world religions such as Buddha, Christ and Mohammed.
- D** To treat all work as worship, and service to man as service to God.
- D** To make all possible attempts to alleviate human suffering by spreading education, rendering medical service, extending help to villagers through rural development centres, etc.
- D** To work for the all-round welfare of humanity, especially for the uplift of the poor and the downtrodden.
- D** To develop harmonious individuals through their combined practice of Jnana, Bhakti, Yoga and Karma.

The motto of Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission is: 'Atmano mokshartham jagad hitaya cha: For one's own liberation, and for the welfare of the world'

Although Ramakrishna Math and Ramakrishna Mission are legally and financially separate, they are closely inter-related in several other ways, and are to be regarded as twin organizations. The Math and the Mission together have 172 branch centres all over India and in different parts of the world.

**Legal Standing:** RAMAKRISHNA MISSION is a registered society in which monks of Ramakrishna Math and lay devotees cooperate in conducting various types of social service mainly in India.

**Registration Status:** Registered in 1909 as the Ramakrishna Mission under act XXI of 1860.



## II. A PROFILE OF THE UNIVERSITY

The Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University came into existence by virtue of a Gazette Notification dated 5 January 2005 of the Government of India. The notification was mooted by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, under section 3 of the University Grants Commission Act of 1956. The formal inauguration of the university took place on 4 July 2005, Swami Vivekananda's Mahasamadhi day. The first convocation of the university was held on 2 September 2006 at its first off-campus centre of Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education, Coimbatore.



Swami Vivekananda envisioned that Belur Math would be a centre of great harmony and synthesis, not only of all religious beliefs and traditions, but also of arts and sciences and the various branches of knowledge, both secular and spiritual. It would be the centre of great spiritual and cultural awakening.

**Aims and Objectives – The Vision:** The present university is intended to actualize Swami Vivekananda's fundamental educational ideas of imparting life-building, man-making and character-building education by combining the best elements of the East and the West. The aim of the Faculty Centre is to provide opportunities for education and research in the disciplines of agriculture and spiritual studies. Value education will therefore be an essential component in all the courses.

**Administrative Aspects:** The University will be an international university that could operate through and from any of the branch-centres of Ramakrishna Mission in India and abroad. It is a cluster of institutions, all of them belonging to branches of Ramakrishna Mission, with headquarters at Belur Math.



**The Major Thrust Areas:** To start with, four major thrust areas were chosen because these have received little emphasis in any of the other conventional universities in India. They are thus the gap-areas in which the present university would operate.

- R Disability Management and Special Education
- R Integrated Rural Development including Tribal Development
- R Indian Cultural & Spiritual Heritage and Value Education
- R Disaster Management including Relief and Rehabilitation

**Specialized Faculty Centres:** For each of these thrust areas, selected centres of the Ramakrishna Mission, called Specialized Faculty Centres, were short listed to harness their past experience and expertise. Till date, the following Faculties have been started and are offering courses in related areas:

**A. DISABILITY MANAGEMENT AND SPECIAL EDUCATION:** International Human Resource Development Centre (IHRDC) for the Disabled at the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu, became the first faculty of the University, namely, Faculty of Disability Management and Special Education (FDMSE). The centre was already involved in training Special Education professionals at the national and international levels.

A formal inauguration of six courses in the FDMSE was made at the IHRDC on August 2005.

**B. INTEGRATED RURAL DEVELOPMENT INCLUDING TRIBAL DEVELOPMENT:** The University Grants Commission approved the following Faculty Centers as 'Off Campus' centers of the RKMVU for offering courses in rural and tribal development:

1. **Ramakrishna Mission Ashrama, Morabadi, Ranchi, Jharkhand:** A Faculty of 'Integrated Rural and Tribal Development' (IRTD) was started and it is offering a five-year integrated MSc Course IRTD and one year Post Graduate Diploma in 'Agro-based Bio-technology.
2. **Ramakrishna Mission Loka Siksha Parishad, Narendrapur, West Bengal:** On 25 September 2006, a Faculty for Integrated Rural Development and Management (IRDM) at Narendrapur Centre, Kolkata, was inaugurated by the General Secretary of the Ramakrishna Math & Mission. The Faculty is offering a two year MSc Course in IRDM and one year Post Graduate Diploma in Agro-based Bio-technology.



**C. INDIAN SPIRITUAL AND CULTURAL HERITAGE AND VALUE EDUCATION:** To sensitize and expose the youth of India to the great ideas embedded in our hoary heritage, a series of course called 'Integral Self Development' (Susamanvita Atma-vikas) were planned. The first of these courses, a diploma on 'Holistic Living with an Elevated Mind', was inaugurated on 9 December 2005 by Rev. President Maharaj of the Ramakrishna Math and Mission.




The Ramakrishna Institute of Moral and Spiritual Education, Mysore, Karnataka, has been entrusted to start a separate faculty to cater to such subjects.

#### **D. VIVEKANANDA RESEARCH CENTRE AND VIVEKANANDA SCHOOL OF FUNDAMENTAL SCIENCE AND PHILOSOPHY:**

Vivekananda Research Centre for fundamental science and philosophy is located in Swami Vivekananda's ancestral house in Kolkata to conduct research on various aspects of Indian culture and philosophy, Ramakrishna-Vivekananda thought, Vedanta vis-à-vis modern science, consciousness studies, and some areas of fundamental science. Among the fundamental sciences, contemplated topics are theoretical physics, pure mathematics and theoretical computer science, to start with.

The formal inauguration of the 'Vivekananda School of Fundamental Science and Philosophy' and 'Vivekananda Research Centre' was held at the Vivekananda's ancestral house on 4 July 2005. Later, the University Grants Commission approved the Vivekananda Research Centre for doctoral and post-doctoral research in Mathematical Sciences, Philosophy, Ramakrishna-Vivekananda thought, Consciousness Studies, etc.



### **III. A PROFILE OF THE FACULTY CENTRE FOR AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION AND RESEARCH (FAR)**

**CAMPUS:** Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University Faculty centre for Agricultural Education and Research (RKMVU-FAR) is located in the Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, a major educational centre of the Ramakrishna Mission. The Vidyalaya is situated 19 kms from Coimbatore City on the highway to Ootacamund, and is set in a serene environment spread over nearly 300 acres. The Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya, Coimbatore, was started in 1930 with an investment of Rs. 5.75 and one harijan boy on its roll. Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of the Nation, laid the foundation stone of the Vidyalaya in one of its temporary campuses in early 1934. Later in the year, the Vidyalaya moved finally to its present sprawling campus. The Vidyalaya was affiliated to the Ramakrishna Mission in January 1935. Over a period of more than 85 years, the Vidyalaya has grown into a comprehensive and reputed complex with 19 educational institutions training over 7500 students every year, offering them facilities for education ranging from the pre-school to doctoral levels.

## Quality and Excellence in Teaching

1. The faculty offers facilities such as class room with LCD projectors well established Experimental farm cropped with sugarcane and coconut and has an orchard with Mango, Sapota, Guava, Pomegranate, Afghan Fig, Date palm trees. There is a kitchen garden and Lab lab field. A small medicinal garden is also available. A bio-gas generation unit, Livestock farm (Dairy and Goatery Unit), Sylvatic birds, Mushroom production unit and a vermicompost unit are available. Organic composting yards are available. Separate fields have been earmarked as wetlands, garden lands and dry lands. A cafeteria of different crops is raised for the practical exposure of students..
2. Hands on training in scientific agricultural and horticultural techniques and analytical skills are taught to students.
3. State-of-art knowledge in wider disciplines of agriculture are being imparted to the students to meet the global challenges.
4. Training programmes to take up commercial agriculture is integrated as a component of curriculum.
5. Exposure to motivational events for students to make them job providers rather than job seekers.
6. Experiential Learning and Rural Agricultural Work Experience is introduced in the curriculum to offer scope for participatory and bottom up approaches of learning process.

**Laboratories:** In addition to the classrooms and the lecture halls, the Faculty has additional rooms for the following laboratories:

**Library and Information Centre:** The Faculty has a good library with adequate books, journals and magazines. This library has adequate collection of extensive reference books including encyclopaedias, dictionaries, different subjects in agriculture and multimedia facilities.

**Academic Discipline:** The students are closely counselled and guided so that they attend to their assigned works at the allotted times. The day is scheduled to cater to the different needs of our students under the efficient supervision of experienced teachers. Most of the time of a student is spent in the campus either in the reading room, class rooms, playgrounds or attending to their hostel routine. Permission from the hostel warden / supervisor is compulsory to leave the campus. Normally, visitors are not allowed during week days. In case of necessity they should take prior permission from Secretary / Warden / Assistant Administrative Head.

**Hostel:** The Faculty has a neat and simple hostel. A full-time warden looks after the activities of the hostel with the assistance of supervisors. He stays in the hostel round the clock and attends to the needs of the students, acting as a friend, philosopher and guide.

**Canteen:** The Faculty has a canteen facility for the students and teachers while they are on the campus. This canteen is open also to the parents, visitors and guests of the institution. It functions from about 8 am to 6 pm on all working days.

**Playground:** The campus has a multi-purpose spacious auditorium, a fitness centre and several playgrounds, both indoor and outdoor. It also has extensive play facilities that include a 400 mts. track, standard fields for hockey, football, volleyball, tennis, ball badminton, kabaddi, etc., for the students.

**Indoor Stadium:** A well-equipped indoor stadium of international standard is a special feature of this institution. A good physical fitness centre also is available for the students and staff of this college. This is kept open in the mornings and evenings so that the students can use this facility after the academic hours.



**Auditorium:** Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya has a common spacious auditorium, named the GKD auditorium, which can accommodate nearly 800 persons. Cultural functions, get-togethers, seminars, memorial lectures, etc. are held in this auditorium. A well-maintained garden surrounds this auditorium and a canteen is located adjacent to it.



**Vidyalaya Agri Park:** Dr. S. Ayyappan, Secretary (DARE), Govt. of India and Director General, Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR), New Delhi inaugurated the 'Vidyalaya Agri Park' which was developed in front of the Agriculture Institute. The park stands as a model for landscaping. It creates an aesthetic appearance besides educative to students.



**Nakshatra Vanam:** Sri Ramakrishna Mission Vidyalaya is venturing into the establishment of a unique effort of growing Nakshatra Vanam comprising of 108 trees species for each padas of 27 stars of the zodiac (27 stars x 4 padas = 108 trees). This could be the pioneering effort not only in our country but in the Universe. Devotees worship species for their particular 'padaas' by way of watering and silent prayers, besides meditating under the tree. Going around the 'Nakshatra Vanam' will be considered as equivalent to perform "Girivalam" (going around the hill temple) at 'Kailash mountain', 'Govarthana mountain and also 'Thiruvannamalai mountain'.



**Ramayana park:** The park is expected to stimulate the interest of our children in the fascinating story of the Ramayana and Mahabharata. The park contains eye-catching, animated characters from the epics, representing various incidents mentioned in them. The idea is to motivate children to go round the park and acquire a fairly good idea of the Ramayana. For elaborations, illustrated boards with children-friendly narratives have been displayed at each station for the benefit of interested children and guardians.



**Vivekananda park:** An impressive 10½ feet bronze image of Swami Vivekananda, cast in Kolkata under the close supervision of a monk of the Ramakrishna Order, was installed here on 3 February 2005, the Vidyalaya's Foundation Day. It serves a particular need of the people, adults and children of the area, viz. a healthy, safe and serene place to relax, which most of the residential localities lack. The imposing image of the Swami, placed facing the Coimbatore-Ooty highway, and in a beautiful landscape, is a daily reminder to the travellers on the road of the renowned monk who did so much for India in particular, and to humanity in general.



# B.Sc. (Agriculture)

## ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

### I. GENERAL

- Only **boys** are eligible for admission.
- Candidates satisfying the eligibility conditions given below as on the last date of submission of application are eligible to apply. The candidates passing the qualifying examination after the last date of submission of application shall not be considered.
- Candidate should be a Citizen of India.

### II. EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS

- Higher Secondary Course (HSC) – Academic Stream:** Candidates should have passed all the subjects in Academic stream of the Qualifying Examination with 10+2 years of schooling under Board of Higher Secondary Education of Government of Tamil Nadu / Central Board of Secondary Education / Council for The Indian School Certificate Examinations / other State Government Boards / other International Boards that are recognized, are eligible for the degree programme.

Candidates who studied any one of the following groups are eligible to apply:

Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology	Physics, Chemistry, Biology with a fourth (elective) subject of any science subject having marks (not Grades).	Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology

- Higher Secondary Course (HSC) – Vocational Stream:** Candidates who have passed **Higher Secondary Course (HSC)** under Vocational stream and studied Biology and Agricultural Practices as vocational subjects including theory and practicals, are eligible to apply for B.Sc.(Agriculture) degree.
- Number of Attempts to Pass:** The maximum number of permissible attempts to pass in the qualifying examination is as follows:
  - Scheduled Castes / Scheduled Tribes : Three
  - All other Communities : Two
- Age Limit**

Candidates should not have completed the age of 21 years on the first day of July of the admission year (i.e. as on 1.7.2015).
- Physical Fitness**

A certificate regarding the physical standards prescribed shall be obtained from any qualified Medical Practitioner at the time of admission.

### III. SYSTEM OF EDUCATION

The pattern of instruction and evaluation in the University is the "**Semester Course Credit System**" in the medium of English. Under graduate Programme are of 8 Semesters (4 years) duration. An enrolled student in order to earn a Bachelor's Degree should complete the course credits prescribed from time to time and should have earned a minimum Overall Grade Point Average (OGPA) of 6.50 out of 10.00. In addition to the above, students, in the judgment of the Faculty should possess good conduct and character.

#### IV. NOTEBOOK (LAPTOP) COMPUTERS

Laptop computer is mandatory for the undergraduate students of RKMVU. The e-learning initiatives in RKMVU necessitate use of laptop computers for learning as well as for assignments. Admitted candidates should bring their laptop computers at the time of commencement of classes.

#### V. RAGGING

Ragging in any form, place or time is a cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment including summary expulsion from the institution. (Tamil Nadu Government Gazette Extra ordinary dt.29.01.97, Bill No. 8 of 1997, Tamil Nadu Publication of Ragging Act.)

**Other fee like books, manuals, records, field uniforms, lab dress, sports dress with shoes, study tours, implements and self supporting fee are notified in the office.**

#### VII. REFUND OF FEES

Semester fees for the newly admitted candidates are collected at the time of admission just before opening of the College. Hence, semester fees paid, except caution money deposit, are not refundable. Caution money deposit paid is refundable after the completion of the degree program or discontinuance from RKMV University.

#### VIII. HOSTEL

For the students of Ramakrishna Mission Vivekananda University Faculty Centre for Agricultural Education and Research, hostel is compulsory. The details of charges for accommodation in hostels are given below:

\*This fee has to be paid by the students at the time of admission and would exclusively cover the room rent, electricity, water and establishment charges.

#### IX. CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

The following code of conduct shall be observed by the students who are admitted:

- The students should conduct themselves in an exemplary manner so as to be model for other students.
- All students will have to strictly adhere to the rules and regulations of the University.
- Those who are having keen interest in the course only can join.
- RAGGING:** The candidates should not indulge or participate in any kind of ragging. If they are found to have indulged in ragging in the past, or noticed later, the candidates will be removed from the roll of the institution at whatever stage of study and criminal action will be taken against the candidates.
- If any student is involved in ragging or any other anti- social activities, he will be expelled and criminal proceedings may be launched against him.
- The students should be present during all working days and sincerely apply themselves to studies. They should avoid applying for leave now & then.
- The students should attend the classes regularly and punctually and should fulfil the attendance

requirement of 80% as prescribed by the University, to be eligible to appear for the University Examinations.

- h. The campus is "Tobacco Free" and "Liquor Free". Any violation of this will result in dismissal of the candidate.
- i. Use of mobile phones and other electronic gadgets are not permitted in the class rooms, examination halls, hostel, university organized functions / programmes / extracurricular and co-curricular activities.
- j. **Dress Code:** Students need to wear formal dress White pant and Shirts for Theory classes and functions and Green Pant and Shirts for Practical Classes (Supplied by the college). Use of T-Shirts / Jeans and other modern outfits should be avoided during working hours and formal functions.

#### **X. DISPUTE REDRESSAL**

With regard to the interpretation of the provisions of any matter not covered in this information brochure, the decision of the RKMV University shall be final and binding on all the parties concerned.

Any complaints, grievances etc., related to UG admissions and academic matters must be first referred to the Administrative Head / Assistant Administrative Head, Faculty Centre for Agricultural Education and Research, Coimbatore who will be the appellate authority with respect to such complaints / disputes. The Courts having their jurisdiction at Coimbatore alone can adjudicate on all matters and disputes related to Under Graduate admissions and academic matters.

#### **XI. LOCATION AND ACCESS**

The University campus is situated 19 kms. from the Coimbatore City on the highway to Ootacamund.

#### **XII. RULES AND REGULATIONS**

1. Dress code prescribed by the University must be followed in the campus.
2. Use of cell phone by students is strictly prohibited within the Vidyalaya campus.
3. **Bicycle is compulsory.**
4. Smoking and consumption of intoxicating liquor or any other similar material is forbidden in the campus.
5. The University and hostel routine, such as common prayer, study hours, community work, etc., are mandatory for all the students.
6. All matters relating to students discipline will be dealt with by a disciplinary committee constituted by the University and its decision will be final.
7. All students must bring their parents/guardians for Parents Meetings conducted at least once in a semester. Students from other states/overseas shall have to compulsorily nominate a local guardian by requesting a faculty of the University or any other person as Local Guardian residing in and around Coimbatore and willing to attend such meetings.
8. Lapses in discipline in maintaining attendance, regularity, unruly behaviour, leave without permission, etc., will result in fine, short suspension, or, in exceptional cases, expulsion from the University, as per the recommendation of the Dean or Disciplinary Committee.
9. The University reserves the right to modify or change any of the conditions mentioned in the prospectus from time to time.
10. It is a faculty residential course.

## **SRI RAMAKRISHNA MISSION VIDYALAYA INSTITUTE OF AGRICULTURE AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT (SRMV-IARD)**

The School of Agriculture started with just 13 students with an objective of giving impart training in Agriculture, in 1956 under the scheme National Council for Rural Higher Education (NCRHE), Govt. of India has completed 56 years of its valuable service to the society.

The institute is fortunate to have visits from great and distinguished personalities like Sri Lal Bahadur Shastri, the Prime Minister of India, Sri K. Kamaraj, the Chief Minister of Madras. This Institute offers a two-year diploma course in Agriculture that includes extension activities for the upliftment of rural masses. The Institute imparts Agricultural Education adopting the latest findings and technologies in Agriculture besides extension activities in the villages. The Institute takes effective steps to teach the students about the self-employment activities in Agriculture and allied sectors. Value based education forms a part of the curriculum.

It has been producing professionals who are preferred by many enterprises working in the field of agriculture and allied trades for their high standards. For the past eight years, all the students who graduated from the institute have been getting jobs (100% placements) through campus interviews.
